

# Interior Surfaces

## Edge Profiles, Face Finishes, Joint Styles

### EDGE PROFILES

**Sawn:** Four sides of the stone are precisely cut for a crisp, clean edge.

**Bevel:** An additional step to the sawn process, used to create a clean angle cut to the face of the tile.

**Chisel:** An additional step to the sawn process, used to create an irregular chiseled cut to the face of the tile.

**Tumbled:** A process used to create an aged look to the finished product by producing a rough, yet soft, edge.

### FACE FINISHES

**Polished:** The face of the stone is polished repeatedly to create a high-gloss finish.

**Honed:** Same process as polished, but the process is stopped before a high gloss is achieved to create a soft, matte look.

**Brushed:** The face of the stone is polished with a wire brush or coarse polisher to create a slightly textured, matte finish.

### JOINT STYLES

**Butt Joint:** The edges of the tile are set together tightly and no grout is added between the tiles.

**Grout Joint:** The edges of the tile are set apart to allow movement between tiles and to create a traditional look with grout added between the tiles.
